GOD'S APPOINTED TIMES ISRAEL TOUR

Day 1: Sunday, February 20

Depart from the United States to Israel

We will depart from Atlanta on an overnight transatlantic flight and begin our memorable journey to the Holy Land. You will be served complimentary in-flight meals and beverages as you enjoy rest and fellowship with newfound friends and anticipation of the life-changing days in the land where our Yashua walked.

Day 2: Monday, February 21

Arrive in Israel – Bruchim Haba'aim

Welcome to Israel

Arrive at the new Ben-Gurion Airport in **Tel Aviv** where we will be met by our tour representative after passport control who will assist us through the baggage claim area and lead us to the exit gates where we will be introduced to **Yosef Gelem (Yossi)** our tour guide and board our bus. We will travel north to **Kibbutz Ma'agan Holiday Village** which is situated on the southern seashore of the Sea of Galilee to enjoy dinner and check into our room.

Day 3: Tuesday, February 22

The Journey to Galilee

Begin your day with breakfast at the hotel. Our journey takes us west on the shores of the Sea of Galilee to see the remains of the ancient village **Beth Saida**. We drive up to the **Mount of Beatitudes** for a spectacular view of the Sea of Galilee where Yashua delivered what is perhaps the most significant sermon ever preached - "Sermon On The Mount" (Matt. 5). Continue on to **Kfar Nachum** (Capernaum), the center of Yashua's Galilean ministry and the site of many of His miracles (Mark 2:4; Matt. 8:5; 14-17; 9:1-7; 17:18), see the remains of Shimon's (Peter's) house and the synagogue site where Yashua taught and worshiped (Mark 1:21; Luke 4:31). We take an hour long **boat cruise on the Sea of Galilee to Kfar Ginosar** and visit the **Alon Museum** to view the ancient Yashua boat and do a bit of shopping. Stop to enjoy a **St. Peter's Fish Lunch** on the Kinneret (Sea of Galilee). In the late afternoon, we drive further south to the city of **Tiberias**, a bustling city located on the shores of the Kinneret, which is one of the four holy Jewish cities in Israel. We continue south stopping at the Yardenit where we will Mikvah. We end our day with dinner and overnight at Kibbutz Ma'agan.

Day 4: Wednesday, February 23

Golan / Tel Facher / Banias Springs / Tel Dan

After an early breakfast, we will begin our day off the beaten track with a bumpy jeep ride in the **Golan Heights** near Mt. Bental. We will have an opportunity to get a glimpse of Israel's neighbors and borders as it tells the heroic stories of the defenders of the Golan. Continue to **Mt. Bental**, the observation point over the city of **Kuneitra**, and the Syrian territory. Stop at **Tel Facher**, a former Syrian army camp. Continue to **Herman National Park**. Here we will have time to walk along **Banias Springs**. It is considered to be the largest spring, feeding from Mt. Hermon and leading into the Jordan River. We end our day at **Tel Dan Nature Park**, believed to be the ruins of what was in Biblical times the city of **Dan**, named after the tribe of Dan, described in the Book of Judges as the largest of the twelve Israelite tribes. We will return to Kibbutz Ma'agan for dinner and overnight.

Day 5: Thursday, February 24

Caesarea / Haifa / Acre / Rosh Hanikra

After breakfast this morning we drive through **Wadi Ara** back towards the coastal highway. Our first stop will be **Caesarea**, once the Roman capital of the region. See the ancient Roman theatre built by Herod. Here Shaul (Paul) embarked on his journey to Tarsus (Acts 9:30) and where Cornelius and his family lived. Explore the restored Roman amphitheater, with its acoustic theatrical sound which was used for many performances throughout the centuries. See the hippodrome aqueduct and the harbor. Continue our travel north towards **Haifa** and ascend **Mt. Carmel** to the site of Elijah and for a panoramic view of **Haifa Bay** and the Botanical Gardens below. We will visit **"AF AL PI CHEN"**, the naval museum of the illegal immigration to Israel at the time of the British mandate. Explore **Elijah's Cave**, where Elijah came to pray before challenging the Prophets of Baal. Drive to **Acre** to walk along the old harbor and local market. Continue to the northernmost point of Israel at **Rosh Hanikra**; descend by cable car into the limestone Grottoes. Drive along the Rabbinical Hills of the Galilee back down to Kibbutz Ma'agan for dinner and overnight.

Day 6: Friday, February 25

Megiddo / Beit Shean / Jerusalem

After breakfast, we will depart from the north making our way towards Jerusalem. We drive to **Megiddo**, one of King Solomon's walled fortified cities (1st Kings 9:15; 10:26), tour the excavations which dates back roughly 5,000 years and where archaeologists have unearthed an incredible 25 layers of settlement built on top of each other that covers a period of 35 centuries. Here the Books of Daniel and Revelation will come alive as we read about the final Battle of Armageddon while viewing the **Plains of Jezreel**. Continue on to the ancient remains of **Beit Shean** and walk through the incredible excavations of the largest ongoing archaeological dig in the land of Israel with its amphitheatre, colonnaded Roman streets, mosaics and the Roman bathhouse. Later, it became a Canaanite city, one which was not captured immediately by the Israelite conquest of Eretz Israel (Josh. 17:11, 16). However, it would eventually be allotted to the tribe of Manasseh (Josh. 17:11). It became an Israelite city in the time of Solomon. It was on the walls of Beit Shean that the Philistines hanged the bodies of King Saul and his sons after the crushing defeat on Mt. Gilboa (1 Samuel 31:9). Continue through the lush **Jordan Valley**, where the desert is starting to bloom with flowers and vegetation of every description (Isaiah 35:1-2). Traveling south through the Judean Wilderness, we will arrive at the mountains of **Judea**. As we enter **Jerusalem**, we will stop at **Mt. Scopus** for a beautiful panoramic view of Jerusalem and the Old City. Here we will open **Shabbat** with the blessing over bread and wine. We will arrive at the **Prima Royale Hotel** to check in, relax, and have our first dinner in Jerusalem.
Shabbat Shalom!!!

Day 7: Saturday, February 26

Free day in Jerusalem

After breakfast, we will enjoy a day at leisure in Jerusalem. Feel the special atmosphere of Jerusalem on Shabbat. This afternoon we will come together for midrash and Q&A. In the evening, walk the streets of Jerusalem, such as **Ben Yehuda Street**, where the many young Jerusalemites gather. Walk along the Midrehov and see the many artists displaying their jewelry and crafts, as well as many sidewalk cafes. We will enjoy dinner and overnight at the **Prima Royale**.

Day 8: Sunday, February 27

Old City of Jerusalem

After breakfast, we will ascend atop **Mount of Olives** for a beautiful panoramic view of the Old City and for an overview of the history of Jerusalem. We then drive through the **Kidron Valley** to **Mt. Zion** and the City of David. We will visit the **Church of St. Peter in Gallicantu**. This was the palace of high priest Caiaphas, where Yashua was brought to jail after his arrest. We proceed to the **tomb of King David** on Mt. Zion and climb a flight of stairs to the **Upper Room**, which may be the site where Yashua had his last Passover Meal before he was captured. Walk along the restored Jewish Quarter, "**Cardo**", meaning the "heart" of this ancient Byzantine City. While in the Jewish Quarter we will visit the **Temple Institute** to see the preparation of the 3rd Temple. Precede to the **Western Wall Tunnels**. Inside, a most interesting model shows the different dwelling periods and history of the inhabitants of Jerusalem. Stand on the site believed to be the nearest spot to the "Holy of Holies". We will see the ruins and the **Robinson Arch**, which was used to lead the high priests into the Temple. In the same complex, we will enter the museum of the **Davidson Center** for an audio/visual presentation of the Temple Period procedures. Walk through **Jaffa Gate** to **David's Tower Museum** and see the ancient remains of the city beginning with the first Temple period. We continue walking along the path to the **City of David**. The tour starts with a 10-minute 3-D movie. It gives a visual timeline of the geography of the City of David from the original settlement to present day. We then descend into the ground to **Hezekiah's Tunnel**, built somewhere near 700 B.C. The tunnel was needed to bring fresh water from outside the fortified City of David (from the Gihon Spring) to the inside (deposited into the Pool of Shiloam) so that the city would have drinking water during any siege (the tunnel's construction is referred to in Isaiah 22:9). As part of the tour you can do the 40-minute walk in knee-high water from the **Gihon Spring** to the **Pool of Shiloam**. We will return to Prima Royale for dinner and overnight.

Day 9: Monday, February 28

Dead Sea / Qumran / Massada / Jerusalem

(Remember to bring your hats, swimming suits and sunblock with you!) After an early breakfast, we will depart and drive through the **Judean Wilderness** to the Dead Sea area. Stop at **Qumran**, the site where a young sheppard boy found the Dead Sea Scrolls. Continue south to the legendary mountaintop plateau of **Massada**. We will ascend by cable car and explore the ancient synagogue and fortress. Here, was the last stronghold of the Jewish Zealots in their struggle against the Romans. The Zealots held out for three years against the legions of Flavius Silva and chose to die as free men at their own hands rather than submit to Roman slavery. From the top of Massada, the outlines of the Roman encampments are still visible below. We will continue on and arrive at the shores of the **Dead Sea** for lunch and to experience floating in the unsinkable waters; here we are at the lowest point on the surface of the earth at 1305 feet below sea level. We will travel to the beautiful **Ein Gedi Nature Reserve**. Take a short hike to "Nahal David" the freshwater spring, and see the majestic waterfalls of this lush Oasis in the desert. In late afternoon, we will take part in the **Genesis Land "Dinner in Abraham's Tent"**, where we enjoy a trip back in time: a reliving of life in the time of the Patriarchs, complete with costume, dramatic presentation, and authentic food. We return to Prima Royale in Jerusalem for our overnight stay.

Day 10: Tuesday, March 1

Dig for a Day

This morning after breakfast we will take part in an active dig at the **Beit Guvrin Caves** and prepare to get your hands dirty as you uncover pottery from the Hellenistic period, 2,300 years ago, followed by a crawl through the **Maresha Cave Labyrinth**. After lunch we travel through the Philistine Country and then we drive to the **Valley of Elah**, where David encountered Goliath (1 Samuel 17). After reliving this story, we drive up the historic **Beth Horon Road** (Joshua 10:10) to the **Benjamin Plateau**, passing ancient Gibeon. Visit **Rachel's Tomb** on the outskirts of **Bethlehem**. We return to Prima Royale in Jerusalem for our overnight stay.

Day 11: Wednesday, March 2

Western Wall / Mea Shearim / Israel Museum / Holyland Model / Yad Vashem

Depart the hotel and arrive to the **Western Wall** in the old city of Jerusalem. Celebrate the Bar/Bat-Mitzvah ceremonies at the kotel. Continue to **Mea Shearim** and learn about the unique lifestyle of the ultra orthodox communities. Drive to West Jerusalem and pass by the Knesset, Israel's parliament and see the **Menorah** with the biblical emblem. Next visit the **Israel Museum** and the **Shrine of the book**. This is where the Dead Sea Scrolls are housed, and the new Holy Land model (a miniature replica of Jerusalem as it was during the second temple period) is located. Drive to **Mount Hertzal**, the military cemetery and **Yad Vashem**, the memorial to the Holocaust. We head to **Joppa** and Tel Aviv for our **Farewell Dinner at the Maganda Restaurant**. After dinner, we proceed to the Tel Aviv Airport, checking in for our return flight home.

Day 12: Thursday, March 3

Arrive in the U.S.A.

We arrive in Atlanta early this morning. Taking home fond memories of Israel that will last a lifetime.

LAND TRANSPORTATION: As specified in the respective tour itineraries. Where motor coaches are specified, these are modern, large-windowed, air-conditioned/heated vehicles designed especially for sightseeing. The cost of the land arrangements as outlined in this brochure is based on a busload ranging from 15/25 tour participants as available locally.

HOTELS: As specified in brochure. The tour price is based on shared accommodation in twin-bedded room with private shower or bath. A limited number of single rooms are available at additional supplements stated in brochure. Single rooms when available are often smaller than doubles. Tour participants without a roommate will have to pay the single rate.

RESERVATIONS may be secured upon payment of a deposit in the amount per person, as specified in the tour brochure. We recommend this be done far in advance of departure to allow adequate time to secure passports, visas and other documents.

DEPOSIT AND FINAL PAYMENT: A deposit of \$500 per person is due upon confirmation, and full payment is required 90 days (November 22, 2010) prior to departure. Final payment received 89-69 day's prior, add \$45 to tour price; 68-26 days add \$75 to tour price. Within the last 25 days, add a total of \$100 to the tour price. Final documents will not be released until receipt of full payment. Extraordinary mail charges required by late booking, changes, or late payments must be borne by the passenger or tour host.
