

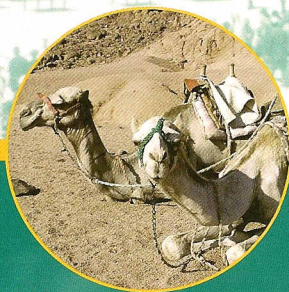
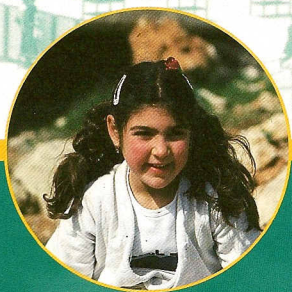
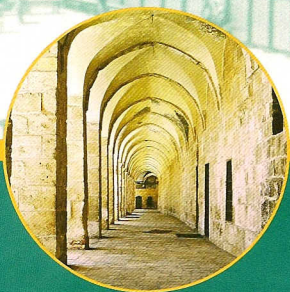

DAY 1, SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 21—DEPARTURE

Flight from the U.S to Israel

DAY 2, SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 22—ARRIVAL IN ISRAEL/BRUCHIM HABA'AIM/WELCOME TO ISRAEL

Arrive at the new Ben-Gurion Airport. Meet our representative after passport control that will assist through the baggage claim area and lead us to the exit gates where we will meet our guide and board our bus. Transfer to Kibbutz Ma'agan on the southern seashores of the Sea of Galilee for dinner and overnight.

DAY 3, MONDAY, FEBRUARY 23—THE GALILEE

This morning we drive east on the shores of the Sea of Galilee and head towards Kibbutz Ein Gev. We take a boat and cross the Sea of Galilee to Kfar Ginosar. Here we visit the Alon Museum to view the ancient Jesus boat. We will have time to do a bit of shopping on the museum campus. We drive up to the Mount of Beatitudes for a spectacular view of the Sea of Galilee from the north. We then drive south and stop at a restaurant to have the famed Peter's Fish lunch. In the afternoon, we drive further south to the city of Tiberias, a bustling city located on the shores of the Kinneret, which is one of the four holy Jewish cities in Israel and the site where Maimonides is buried. We visit Rambam's grave. Spend some time walking around the city before we continue south stopping at the Yardenit where we end our day by having a Mikveh there before we drive to nearby Kibbutz Ma'agan for dinner and overnight.

DAY 4, TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 24—SAFED/KUNEITRA/ BANIAS/TEL DAN

We drive up to the Golan. We travel through the Golan by jeep, off the beaten track. Continue to the Golan Heights; Stop at Mt. Bental, the observation point over the city of Kuneitra, and the Syrian territory. Stop at Tel Facher, a former Syrian army camp; Visit the Banias springs, We end our day at Tel Dan by hiking through the nature park before we retrace our steps to board our bus and return to our home base at Kibbutz Ma'agan for dinner and overnight.

DAY 5, WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 25—CAESAREA/HAIFA/ ACRE (ACO)/ROSH HANIKRA/GALILEE

This morning we drive through Wadi Ara back towards the coastal highway. Our first stop will be at Caesarea-by-the-Sea, once the Roman capital of the region. See the excavations of the crusaders' city, the aqueduct and the amphitheatre that has been restored as a concert venue. Proceed to Haifa for a panoramic view from Mt. Carmel and visit "AF AL PI CHEN", the naval museum of the illegal immigration to Israel at the time of the British mandate. We visit Elijah's Cave, where Elijah came to pray before challenging the Prophets of Baal. Drive to Acre; walk along the old harbor and local market. Continue to the northernmost point of Israel at Rosh Hanikra, descend by cable into the limestone Grottoes. We drive back down to Kibbutz Ma'agan for dinner and overnight.

DAY 6, THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 26—GOLAN HEIGHTS/KATZRIN/ BETH SAIDA

After breakfast, we will enjoy a tour of the Kibbutz then drive up to the Golan Heights where we will experience the magnificent view of the Hula Valley. We will also have the opportunity to do a tree planting in the memory of our loved ones. We then drive further up the Golan Heights and learn about the strategic importance and the history of the Golan while we experience its physical beauty. We continue on to Katzrin, the capital of the Golan and then enjoy a visit to the Golan Olive Oil Mill for a tour and tasting. This major agricultural center combines modern technology with one of Israel's oldest industries. On the way back we stop at Beth Saida to see the remains of this ancient Village on the shores of the Sea of Galilee. We will return back to our Kibbutz for dinner.

DAY 7, FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 27—MEGIDDO/BEIT SHEAN/BEIT ALPHA/WESTERN WALL

After breakfast, we will depart from the north making our way towards Jerusalem. We drive to Megiddo and tour the excavations that inspired James Michener's book "The Source," then continue on to ancient remains of Beit Shean. We will walk through the incredible excavations of the largest ongoing archaeological dig

in the land of Israel with its amphitheatre, colonnaded Roman streets, mosaics and the Roman bathhouse. A short distance away, we will visit the Mosaic floors of Beit Alpha. We will drive through the lush Jordan Valley, where the desert is starting to bloom with flowers and vegetation of every description to the Hills of Jerusalem. Upon arrival to Jerusalem, we will go to Mt. Scopus, a point overlooking the Old City and the Western Wall, where we commemorate our arrival to the heart of Judaism with a special She'hechyanu ceremony, a blessing introduced for Jews to offer thanks for new and unusual experiences, and is typically recited at the beginning of holidays and to celebrate special occasions. We will arrive to our hotel, check in and relax. Dinner and overnight at the Grand Court hotel in Jerusalem.

DAY 8, SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 28—FREE DAY IN JERUSALEM

Free day to enjoy the special atmosphere of Shabbat in Jerusalem. Dinner and Overnight at the Grand Court hotel in Jerusalem.

DAY 9, SUNDAY MARCH 1—MT. ZION/WESTERN WALL TUNNELS/DAVIDSON CENTER/DAVID'S TOWER

Start your day at the Mount of Olives for a Panoramic view of the Old City and for an overview of the history of Jerusalem. We then drive through the Kidron Valley to Mt. Zion. We will visit the Church of St. Peter in Gallicantu. We proceed to the tomb of King David on Mt. Zion and the Upper Room. Walk along the Cardo, the ancient Roman road; Visit the four Sephardic synagogues restored after 1967 war in the Jewish quarter. While in the Jewish Quarter take the opportunity to Visit the Temple Institute, the Herodian Mansion and the Tour the Western Wall Tunnels; Visit the Davidson center and walk through the Roman Cardo. Walk through Jaffa Gate to David's Tower museum and see the ancient remains of the city beginning with the first Temple period. We proceed back to the Grand Court Hotel for dinner and overnight.

DAY 10, MONDAY, MARCH 2—THE JEWISH CEMETERY ON MT. OF OLIVES/KIDRON VALLEY/CITY OF DAVID

Today we drive to the Mt. of Olives to the oldest Jewish cemetery, where it is believed the resurrection of the dead will begin when the Messiah comes. Legend has it that a miraculous bridge will span the valley at the end of time, over which the righteous will pass on their way to the Temple Mount. We walk down along the new path down into the Kidron Valley and down the part of the Kidron called the Valley of Jehosafat, where God will judge the nations of the world (Joel 3:12). Another name for the valley is the Vale of the King; it was once intensely cultivated and the revenues went to the king. Zechariah's Tomb, named after a First Temple priest, the Tomb of the Sons of Hezir, a Second Temple-era priestly family, and Absalom's Tomb. The conical-roofed Absalom's Tomb received its name because the Bible says this rebellious son of David built a monument here so he would be remembered. His father's men eventually killed Absalom. Jerusalemites of old would bring their sons to pelt the tomb with stones and recall the fate of rebellious offspring. We continue walking along the path to the City of David. The tour starts with a 10-minute 3-D movie. It gives a visual timeline of the geography of the City of David from the original settlement to present day. We then descend into the ground to Hezekiah's tunnel, built somewhere near 700 B.C. The tunnel was needed to bring fresh water from outside the fortified City of David (from the Gihon Spring) to the inside (deposited into the Pool of Shiloam) so that the city would have drinking water during any siege (the tunnel's construction is referred to in Isaiah 22:9). As part of the tour you can do the 40-minute walk in knee-high water from the Gihon Spring to the Pool of Shiloam. Dinner and overnight at the Grand Court.

DAY 11, TUESDAY, MARCH 3—DEAD SEA/QUMRAN /MASSADA/ JERUSALEM

Drive through the Judean desert to the Dead Sea. Stop at Qumran, the site where the Dead Sea scrolls were found. Continue to Massada, ascend by cable car and tour the ancient fortress; visit the remains of the walls, palaces, synagogue, the bathhouses etc. Descend by cable car. Next stop for lunch, swim (actually float) at the Dead Sea. Take a short hike to "Nahal David" the freshwater spring at the Ein Gedi Nature Reserve, a lush oasis in the Judean Desert overlooking the Dead Sea. In late afternoon, we will take part in the Genesis Land/Dinner in Abraham's Tent,

where we enjoy a trip back in time: a reliving of life in the time of the Patriarchs, complete with costume, dramatic presentation, and authentic food. We return the Grand Court hotel in Jerusalem for overnight.

DAY 12, WEDNESDAY, MARCH 4—DIG FOR A DAY

Take part in an active dig at the Beit Guvrin caves and prepare to get your hands dirty as you uncover pottery from the Hellenistic period, 2,300 years ago, followed by a crawl through the Maresha Cave Labyrinth. After lunch on your own en route, visit the Ayalon Institute near Rehovot, which is the site of a clandestine munitions factory from the British Mandate. Then we drive towards Jerusalem and stop in the Valley of Elah, where David encountered Goliath (1 Samuel 17). After reliving this story, we head up the historic Beth Horon road (Joshua 10:10) to the Benjamin Plateau, passing ancient Gibeon and returning to the Grand Court hotel in Jerusalem.

DAY 13, THURSDAY, MARCH 5—WESTERN WALL/MEA SHEARIM/ISRAEL MUSEUM/HOLYLAND MODEL/YAD VASHEM

Depart the hotel and arrive to the Western Wall in the old city of Jerusalem. Celebrate the Bar/Bat-Mitzvah ceremonies at the kotel. Continue to Mea Shearim and learn about the unique lifestyle of the ultra orthodox communities. Drive south to the region of Bethelhem and visit Rachel's Tomb at the outskirts of Bethlehem. Drive to West Jerusalem and pass by the Knesset, Israel's parliament and see the Menorah with the biblical emblem. Next visit the Israel Museum and the Shrine of the book, where the Dead Sea scrolls are housed, and the new Holy

Land model—a miniature replica of Jerusalem as it was during the second temple period. Drive to Mount Hertzal, the military cemetery and Yad Vashem, the memorial to the Holocaust. Visit the Ammunition Hill, a former Jordanian army stronghold, conquered by the Israeli army in the Six Day War, and converted into a national memorial site and museum. This evening we drive to Tel Aviv for our farewell dinner at the Maganda Restaurant. After dinner, we drive back the Grand Court hotel in Jerusalem for overnight.

DAY 14, FRIDAY, MARCH 6—JERUSALEM

Today we will enjoy a day at leisure in Jerusalem. We can visit some of the places of interest that we have already seen or perhaps take in a bit of shopping in the Old City. We welcome the Shabbat in the Holy City. Dinner and Overnight at the Grand Court hotel in Jerusalem.

DAY 15, SATURDAY, MARCH 7—DEPARTURE JERUSALEM/OLD JAFFA/TEL AVIV/FRANKFURT

We enjoy a leisurely breakfast at our hotel. We board our motorcoach and travel towards Tel Aviv. We visit the port city of Old Jaffa before we proceed on to Tel Aviv's Ben Gurion Airport for our late afternoon flight to Frankfurt. Upon arrival in Frankfurt, we transfer to our hotel in Frankfurt for overnight.

DAY 16, SUNDAY, MARCH 8—FRANKFURT/USA

We depart our hotel in Frankfurt for the airport and our transatlantic flight back to the U.S.A. Take home your fond memories of Israel that will last a lifetime

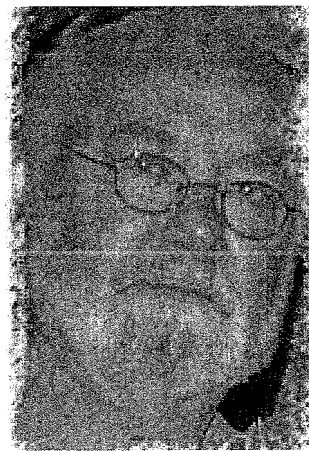

TOUR CONDITIONS

This tour is based on rates, tariffs and ground costs in effect September 2008 at the time of tour quotation and subject to future ARC and IATA fare increases, carrier fuel surcharges, and possible land increase costs in effect at the time the tour operates and subject to change without notice.

LAND TRANSPORTATION: As specified in the respective tour itineraries. Where motor coaches are specified, these are modern, large-windowed, air-conditioned/heated vehicles designed especially for sightseeing. The cost of the land arrangements as outlined in this brochure is based on a busload ranging from 15/25 tour participants as available locally.

HOTELS: As specified in brochure. The tour price is based on shared accommodation in twin-bedded room with private shower or bath. A limited number of single rooms are available at additional supplements stated in brochure. Single rooms when available are often smaller than doubles. Tour participants without a roommate will have to pay the single rate.

MEALS: As per tour brochure. In-flight meals as per the airline's normal meal service policies.

SIGHTSEEING: As specified in each itinerary, including the services of a local multilingual guide. (Right is reserved to vary the sequence of sightseeing programs, or to make substitutions if necessitated by circumstances beyond our control.)

TRANSFERS AND PORTERAGE: Included in each city abroad between airports, rail stations, piers, and hotels and vice versa. Porterage includes the handling of one normal piece of luggage per person. Additional pieces (including garment bags or similar) may be handled at additional charges and collected upon arrival abroad. Free allowance for checked baggage aboard airlines is 44 pounds (Seasoned travelers have found it convenient to use one piece of luggage only.) A special bag tag for quick identification is also provided. Carry-on bag must fit the dimensions of 9 in. by 14 in. by 22 in.

TIPS AND LOCAL TAXES are included, except as noted below, or in the tour brochure.

INCLUDED IN PRICE OF BASIC STANDARD PROGRAM: Round trip airfare, transfers with group to and from overseas airports and piers; shared double room in first class hotels; two meals daily; English speaking guide; transportation and entrance fees to sites to be visited.

NOT INCLUDED: Single room charges; phone calls; valet/laundry service; and other items of a strictly personal nature; baggage or other insurance (which is highly recommended); and any beverage; (Please note that the custom abroad is to include coffee or tea with breakfast only; it is an extra charge when served with other meals, as are mineral waters, wines or liquor); expenses within the U.S.A. or Canada. Also any exception noted on the face of the booking registration form and/or in the tour brochure as indicated in not included box of brochures.

TAXES: Airline, Airline, Custom and Departure taxes are in addition to all air fares. These taxes are subject to change per government regulations and currency fluctuations. Quoted taxes are subject to change. Final taxes will be advised at time of final invoice. It is the responsibility of the group leader and clients to have taxes paid at finalization.

PASSPORTS: All tour members must have a valid passport. Passports are issued for individuals, husband and wife, or for a family. To apply for passports you can contact either your local Passport Office, Clerk of the District or County Court. Of course, your Tour Hosts will be happy to help you obtain the necessary forms for passport application.

DOCUMENTATION: U.S. citizens require a valid passport for international travel, must be valid for 6 months beyond groups return date.

RESERVATIONS AND PAYMENT INFORMATION

RESERVATIONS may be secured upon payment of a deposit in the amount per person, as specified in the tour brochure. We recommend this be done far in advance of departure to allow adequate time to secure passports, visas and other documents.

DEPOSIT AND FINAL PAYMENT: A deposit of \$300 per person is due upon confirmation, and full payment is required 90 days prior to departure. Final payment received 89-69 day's prior, add \$45 to tour price. 68-26 days add \$75 to tour price. Within the last 25 days, add a total of \$100 to the tour price. Final documents will not be released until receipt of full payment. Extraordinary mail charges required by late booking, changes, or late payments must be borne by the passenger or tour host. Naturally, Creative Travel Partners, Inc. of Prospect Heights Illinois does not agree to provide any services until full payment is received.

LAND CANCELLATIONS: In the event of cancellation from day of registration to 90 days prior to departure there is a \$100 per person non-refundable administrative fee. Thereafter the following charges apply 89-45 days prior to departure the charge is \$150; 44-31 days the charge is 55% of total cost of the tour; 30-15 days prior to departure the charge is 75% of the total cost of the tour; 14 days prior to departure the charge is 100% of total cost of the tour. No shows or cancellations after date of departure, no refund whatsoever. All refund claims must be received in writing.

ITINERARY CHANGES: Changes must be requested and approved in writing by Creative Travel Partners Inc of Prospect Heights, Illinois. If you return individually and not with the group, there is a \$100 surcharge plus any additional airfare differential for the deviation. A handling fee of \$25 per person will be made for changes requested after receipt of deposit. This fee will be assessed each time a change is made.
